OTHER PLANT INFO:

Sweet William is an herbaceous perennial or biennial that is often planted as an annual flower. This plant is very slow-growing and is generally easy to care for. If you're looking to invite pollinators to your garden, sweet william makes that easy with its vibrant blooms.

Sweet William does best in full sun and would look wonderful in cottage gardens, perennial beds, or containers. Sweet William is mildly toxic to pets and people, so make sure to plant it in an area that pets don't have access to.

OTHER PLANT INFO:

Perennial delphiniums are frost-hardy but can be damaged by cold wet soil. Mulching for winter protection discourages frost damage. Potted plants do not need to move indoors but should be protected from wind and excessive wet weather. You can make the blooms last longer by ensuring they get at least six hours of full sun daily and consistently moist soil. Provide plenty of nutrients, but keep in mind that too much nitrogen can result in lush foliage at the expense of flower development. Extend the bloom period by removing the center bloom spike when flowers begin to drop. When the initial bloom period ends, cut the plant back to two inches to encourage a second bloom period.

SUN: Full Sun
MOISTURE: Moist, Well drained soil
BLOOM TIME: June - August
SIZE: 18-14" H x 12-24" W

OTHER PLANT INFO:

Chinese lantern is a hardy perennial that provides colorful fall interest. **WARNING ...** Before planting Chinese lantern in a garden bed, be keenly aware that it can grow aggressively and spread quickly via underground rhizomes and by reseeding. Be careful where you plant it because it can overrun your garden beds and even sprout into turfgrass. Chinese lantern grows best in containers to keep it from spreading to other areas of your property. Its appeal lies in the signature lanterns, which are seed pods that mature to a bright pumpkin-orange at the end of the growing season in early fall. Chinese lantern is easy to grow as long as it has enough light and well-draining soil. The fruits, both the berries and the seed pods, as well as the leaves, are highly toxic to both humans and animals.

SUN: Full Sun / Afternoon Shade
MOISTURE: Well drained, consistently moist
SEASON of INTEREST: May - July
SIZE: 20-26" H x 12-18" W
DEER and RABBIT RESISTANT

OTHER PLANT INFO:

Incredible, huge flowers! Tall spikes of long-lasting, bell-shaped flowers. You can expect at least three months of blooms from spring to summer. These plants only live for two years. In the first year, the plant produces small green-leaf rosettes; in the second year, it grows its signature bells. Sunlight is the most significant determinant of flower production. In the heat of the summer, give the plant some shade as relief from the sun by the afternoon. Deadheading the flowers promotes growth throughout bloom. However, to have blooms every year, allow some flower seed pods to mature and use them to re-seed the flower bed each year.

OTHER PLANT INFO:

Technically a tender perennial with tuberous roots, but it's most often grown as an annual in cooler climates (USDA Zones below 7-10) because frost kills it back to the ground. The large, fleshy tuberous roots store energy, allowing it to regrow if conditions are right. It can often reappear the next year even if you didn't save the roots, as seeds drop and sprout. Extravagant mixture contains all of the various colors and patterns of the "Marbles" series! Yellows, reds, oranges, and whites, each flower uniquely striped and splashed with contrasting hues. Attracts hummingbirds, butterflies and especially nocturnal pollinators like moths.

This is an excellent choice for those who like the company of hummingbirds and butterflies in their garden. Native to the eastern half of the U.S. and Canada, this is a super adaptable and easy-to-grow flower that Native Americans held in high esteem as a powerful medicinal. They require very little care; as long as they aren't excessively moist, they will thrive just about anywhere.

OTHER PLANT INFO:

Sweet pea (*Lathyrus odoratus*) is a climbing, flowering, sweet-smelling annual in the legume genus. Encourage more blooms by deadheading or removing spent flowers, so the plant turns its energy to produce more flowers, not pea pods. Also, use fertilizer or amendment that's higher in phosphorus (like bone meal) instead of nitrogen-rich fertilizer. Sweet peas need at least six to eight hours of sun daily; the more sun, the better. However, protect the plant from the hot, sweltering sun with shade, if possible; otherwise, it will begin to die back.

You can expect at least three months of blooms from spring to summer. These plants only live for two years. OTHER PLANT INFO:

This pollinator-friendly perennial comes in a cheerful mix of summery colors and is stunning in landscape and arrangements. The large, 2- to 4-inch flower umbels range in color from cream and lemon to raspberry, cherry, and salmon, making a stunning summer display. The plants have strong, sturdy stems that are ideal for floral design, but you'll want to leave plenty of blooms for the bees! This easy-to-grow, long-lived perennial can be tucked into cottage gardens, rock gardens, beds, and borders, or spread across meadows and prairies.

OTHER PLANT INFO:

Clumping/upright plant that attracts bees, butterflies, hummingbirds and other pollinators. Blanket Flowers are often relatively short-lived. Cutting back clumps to 6" in late summer often increases their chances of winter survival. You can also keep plants vigorous by dividing them every 2-3 years in spring or fall. Can be planted in a container. Companion plants are Echinacea and Daisy.

SUN: Part Shade to Full Sun
SEASON of INTEREST: Summer to Fall
SIZE AT MATURITY: This tree can reach 15' x 15' or more in height and width
USDA Hardiness zone: 5-10

OTHER PLANT INFO:

This self-pollinating hardy fig produces medium size fruit July through frost. It prefers full sun and well drained soil. Fruiting will begin in one to two years after planting. This variety can also be planted in a large pot and brought inside to overwinter. Prune in late winter and during the growing season for shape and size control. Remove weak, dead or diseased stems and thin out branches to encourage fruiting. Winter protection is advised in zones colder than 7.
